REQUIRED *Competitions*

The National United States Pageant utilizes a transparent and balanced scoring system designed to reflect the values of service, leadership, confidence, and overall presentation.

Each delegate will compete in the following areas:

INTERVIEW 50%

FUN FASHION 20%

EVENING GOWN 20%

COMMUNITY SERVICE 10%





INTERVIEW

Your voice is your power.

The private interview is the most significant phase of competition. Judges evaluate communication skills, confidence, authenticity, poise, and depth of community involvement. Delegates should be prepared to speak genuinely about their service initiatives, leadership experiences, goals, and personal achievements.

This phase reflects the heart of our organization — leadership through service.

Interview will be one on one with each judge and judges will use your Interview Sheet for questions. Interviews will be 3 minutes with each judge. No political, religious, or current event questions will be asked.

FUN FASHION

Confidence in every step.

This is an opportunity for delegates to shine and showcase their unique style. Fun Fashion highlights personality and stage presence. Delegates model age-appropriate high fashion outfit of their choice while demonstrating energy, individuality, and confidence. Judges look for natural stage presence and overall presentation.

Denim jeans and casual wear are not allowed.





EVENING GOWN

Grace under the spotlight.

Evening Gown competition evaluates elegance, poise, posture, and stage presence. Delegates are scored on confidence, stage presence, and their ability to command attention with grace and professionalism.

Junior Divisions (*Princess, Jr. Preteen, Preteen, & Jr. Teen*) should have a full skirt or ball gown floor-length style dress.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Impact that extends beyond the stage.

This phase recognizes each delegate's commitment to volunteerism and advocacy. Judges consider the quality and meaningful impact of community involvement efforts.

Each delegate is required to submit 5 hours of community service that benefit a local, area, or state/national non-profit organization with their state title to be awarded the full 10% towards their overall score. Community service will be submitted via a submission form at Pageant Check In, along with emailing photos actively showing your service work – collecting items, volunteering, making a donation (must be donating items), etc.





FINALE SHOW

Opening Number

For the Finale Show each delegate is to wear their choice of either a red or royal blue fancy outfit for Opening Number. Your outfit can be as fancy as you like with stoning, feathers, beads, sequins, ruffles, etc. Short dress, high-low, romper, pants, jumpsuit, etc. Please no long gowns. Your opening number outfit should show off your sense of style and is your first impression on stage to the overall panel of judges.

State sashes will be worn with your Opening Number outfit.





HAIR & MAKEUP GUIDELINES

Enhancing Your Natural Confidence

The National United States Pageant encourages delegates to present themselves in a polished, age-appropriate manner that reflects confidence, poise, and individuality.

Hair and makeup should enhance your natural beauty while maintaining a clean and elegant appearance suitable for each division.

Delegates are free to style themselves in a way that feels comfortable and authentic, while respecting the following guidelines.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Hair and makeup should be age-appropriate and tasteful.
- Styles should complement your overall look and wardrobe.
- The goal is to enhance natural beauty, not overpower it.
- Judges are evaluating confidence, presentation, and authenticity. Judges may deduct points at their discretion if makeup and hair styling is not age appropriate for the division..

Delegates may choose to do their own hair and makeup or work with a professional stylist.

YOUNGER DIVISIONS

(Princess, Jr. Preteen, & Preteen – Under 12)

To preserve age-appropriate presentation, the following guidelines apply:

- Makeup is not required.
- If worn, makeup should be minimal and natural.
- Light lip gloss, light powder, or light blush is acceptable.
- Heavy contouring, dramatic eye makeup, false eyelashes, or bold lipstick are discouraged.

The goal for younger divisions is a fresh, natural appearance that reflects youth and confidence.

OLDER DIVISIONS

(Jr. Teen, Teen, Miss, & Ms./Mrs.)

Delegates may wear makeup appropriate for stage lighting and photography.

Acceptable styling may include:

- Foundation and powder
- Blush and contour (natural application)
- Eye makeup suitable for stage presentation
- False eyelashes if desired
- Lip color that complements the overall look

Makeup should remain refined, balanced, and elegant.



HEADSHOT PHOTO

All delegates are required to submit an official headshot to the National office by June 1st. Headshot photos must follow the guidelines listed below and be submitted by the deadline. Photos that do not follow these guidelines will not be accepted.

- **Professional Photo** in Color with Solid Color Background
- **Size:** 5x7 vertical photo
- **High Resolution:** 300 dpi in JPEG Format
- Photo should be recent and look like the delegate
- No filters - photo should be clear and in focus

SUBMIT YOUR HEADSHOT PHOTO BY JUNE 1ST

Deadline is firm and all photos must be received by the deadline.

Link to submit your Headshot photo will be emailed out and listed in the Delegate Handbook.

PLEASE NOTE

- Screen shots will not be accepted.
- Do not send via social media or email – Photos must via the submission form.
- Do not save the photo to your phone and then upload to the form - it will compress your image and the image will become blurry to print.

AD PAGE INFORMATION

All national delegates receive one Ad Page and design as part of their National Fee. Ad page design will include your headshot photo submitted to the National Office, your name, and your state title.

Delegates and one parent/guardian (if under 18) are required to attend Orientation, as important information will be provided.

TICKETS

Tickets for parents, family, and guests are \$60 per person.

All Gala Tickets must be pre-purchased by the deadline and will not be available during Nationals. Tickets will be available to purchase via our online form and the link will be emailed to delegates closer to Nationals.

Deadline to order tickets is June 10th.

National delegates do not need tickets. Delegate tickets are included in their National Fee.

Any minor national delegates under 18 must be accompanied by a parent.



Any event tickets ordered past the deadline between June 11 and July 1 are subject to an additional fee of \$15 per ticket, per event. Please contact the National Office if you need to order tickets past the deadline.



SHOW TICKETS

Show Tickets must be pre-purchased by the deadline. Tickets will be available to purchase via our online form. After the order deadline July 18, tickets will be available at the door for an additional charge.

Tickets are final sale and non-refundable. You will receive your Show Tickets at Pageant Check In.

OPTIONAL COMPETITIONS

A great way to win additional awards at Nationals!

In addition to our divisional titles, the National United States Pageant proudly offers a variety of Optional Competitions. These competitions provide delegates with additional opportunities to showcase their talents, achievements, and dedication beyond the required areas of competition.

Optional Competitions and Awards are designed to recognize excellence in specific categories and celebrate the unique strengths of each delegate. Participation in optional competitions is not required and does not affect the overall divisional title score unless otherwise stated.

Each optional category is judged independently, and awards are presented within each age division whenever possible.

Optional competitions allow delegates to highlight special skills, personal accomplishments, and additional areas of passion. We encourage participants to view these awards as opportunities for growth, confidence-building, and recognition of their hard work.

At the National United States Pageant, every delegate brings something exceptional to the stage—and our Optional Competitions help us celebrate those individual strengths.

Deadline to enter & pay your Optional Competition Entry Fees is June 1st.



OPTIONAL COMPETITIONS

CASUAL WEAR

Shine in your individuality.

Confidence and personality take center stage in this optional competition. Delegates will model age-appropriate casual attire of their choice. Judging is based on stage presence, individuality, energy, and overall presentation.

Fee: \$100 per entry. Limit 2 entries.

What to Submit: Online Optional Competition Form and Fee.

Wardrobe: Casual wear outfit of your choice. Outfits should be off the rack. No cocktail dresses.

SPOKESMODEL

Use your voice to inspire.

This competition evaluates a delegate's ability to communicate effectively and confidently. Judges look for articulation, clarity, poise, and the ability to represent a platform, sponsor, or message while reflecting the values of the National United States Pageant. Delegates will deliver a 60 to 90 second speech about a cause, their personal platform, or subject that is important to them.

Fee: \$100 per entry. Limit 1 entry

What to Submit: Online Optional Competition Form and Fee.

Wardrobe: Business or career dress, jumpsuit, or suit

NUS WEAR (National United States Wear)

Celebrate the brand. Represent with pride.

A spirited and creative competition where delegates showcase attire inspired by the National United States Pageant brand. Judges consider creativity, confidence, presentation, and overall visual impact. Red, white, or blue outfit of your choice that shows your personality. Outfit can be as fancy as you like - cocktail, romper, hi-low, etc.

Fee: \$100 per entry. Limit 1 entry.

What to Submit: Online Optional Competition Form and Fee.

Wardrobe: Red, white, or blue outfit of your choice that is appropriate for your age division. No swimsuits, costumes, gowns, or props are allowed.

OPTIONAL COMPETITIONS

ACTIVWEAR

Strength. Confidence. Energy.

The Activewear competition highlights confidence and healthy lifestyle representation. Judges evaluate stage presence, personality, and overall confidence in age-appropriate athletic attire.

Your choice of age-appropriate workout activewear outfit to model. For the safety of our delegates, no acrobatic moves are permitted while modeling.

Fee: \$100 per entry. Limit 1 entry.

What to Submit: Online Optional Competition Form and Fee.

Wardrobe: Suggested items for activewear outfits are leggings, biker shorts, capris, athletic shorts, sports bra/tanks, t-shirts, etc. with sneakers or athletic shoes. No bra tops or swimsuits allowed.

PHOTOGENIC

Let your confidence shine through the lens.

The Photogenic Award honors delegates who demonstrate exceptional camera presence. Judging is based on submitted photographs and evaluates expression, authenticity, and visual connection. Photo can be a close up, headshot, full body in black & white or color.

Photos should not show any reference to your title or another pageant. Photogenic photo entries must be a professional high-resolution photo.

Fee: \$75 per entry. Limit 2 photo entries.

1 photo entry = \$75; 2 photo entries = \$150

What to Submit: Online Optional Competition Form and Fee.

PORTFOLIO

Available to all divisions.

Delegates will submit 6 to 8 photos in a modeling portfolio. Can be any combination of editorial photos with and/or without your NUS state crown and sash. Editorial photos are those that could appear in a publication, magazine, sales ads, etc.

Fee: \$125 per entry. Limit 1 entry.

What to Submit: Online Optional Competition Form and Fee.

OPTIONAL COMPETITIONS

STAR MODEL

Own the moment. Be unforgettable.

Star Model celebrates charisma and “star quality.” In addition to strong modeling skills, judges look for personality, audience connection, energy, and the overall presence that sets a delegate apart.

Our Star Model competition is based on entries for:

- Casual Wear
- Photogenic

Delegate must enter both optional competitions Casual Wear, Photogenic (at least one photo entry), and enter the Star Model optional competition to qualify.

Fee: \$75 per entry. Limit 1 entry.

What to Submit: Online Optional Competition Form and Fee. Photo for Photogenic.

EXCELLENCE AWARD **New!**

Lead with heart. Represent with integrity.

Presented to delegates who exemplify outstanding performance, positive attitude, and consistent representation of the organization’s core values throughout the event. Delegates who participate in Optional Competitions during the National Pageant, can earn the NUS Excellence Award by earning 5 credits or more. The Excellence Award is a great keepsake for all your hard work and performances during Nationals.

Casual Wear: 1 credit per entry. Limit 2 entries.

Spokesmodel: 1 credit per entry. Limit 1 entry.

NUS Wear: 1 credit per entry. Limit 1 entry.

Activewear: 1 credit per entry. Limit 1 entry.

Photogenic: 1 credit per entry. Limit 2 entries.

Portfolio: 1 credit per entry. Limit 1 entry.

Top Model: 2 credits per entry. Limit 1 entry.

OPTIONAL COMPETITIONS

TOP MODEL

Confidence Captured. Presence Preserved.

The Top Model photoshoot experience is designed to showcase each delegate's natural confidence, camera presence, and versatility in front of the lens.

During this session, delegates will participate in a professionally guided photoshoot with our national photographer - Catherine Fiehn Photography, where our photographer will observe posing ability, facial expression, posture, and overall comfort. This experience highlights the ability to transition seamlessly from stage presence to photographic presence.

Judging will consider:

- Camera awareness
- Expression and authenticity
- Variety and fluidity of poses
- Confidence and composure
- Overall visual impact

Top Model is not only an evaluation opportunity, but also a confidence-building experience that allows delegates to grow in professionalism and presentation.

This session celebrates the art of modeling while encouraging individuality, poise, and self-assurance.

Delegates will receive a link to download your photos with rights to use for your modeling portfolio, printing, and social media.

Fee: \$150 per entry. Limit 1 entry.

What to Submit: Online Optional Competition Form and Fee.

Wardrobe: Short dress/cocktail, pant outfit, romper, gown, etc. of your choice that is not casual wear

Extra Opportunities. No Extra Cost.

The National United States Pageant proudly offers select Free Optional Competitions to provide delegates with additional opportunities to shine – at no additional entry fee.

These complimentary categories are designed to encourage participation, recognize unique strengths, and celebrate well-rounded excellence.

We believe opportunity should be accessible. Free Optional Competitions are one more way we celebrate effort, initiative, and individuality.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

The Academic Excellence Award honors delegates who demonstrate outstanding commitment to their education while balancing leadership, service, and competition.

At the National United States Pageant, we believe true achievement is reflected not only on stage – but also in the classroom.

This award recognizes the discipline, focus, and perseverance required to maintain strong academic performance while pursuing personal growth and community involvement. Delegates will submit their most recent report card or academic transcript for the 25-26 school year and you may include optional academic honors, awards, or certifications.

CROWNS MAKING AN IMPACT VOLUNTEER SERVICE

At the National United States Pageant, we believe a crown is not just worn – it is lived.

The Crowns Making an Impact Volunteer Service Award recognizes delegates who actively use their state title to create meaningful change within their communities. This award honors those who lead through service, initiative, and consistent involvement.

We want to see the real impact you are making while representing your state. Delegates will submit a log of their service and a digital scrapbook of all your work.

CHARITY SPOTLIGHT ESSAY

The Charity Spotlight Essay Award recognizes delegates who demonstrate thoughtful advocacy, heartfelt compassion, and a deep understanding of service through the power of written expression.

Delegates are invited to submit a 1,500-word essay describing why their charity of choice deserves the spotlight.

HAIR & MAKEUP ARTISTS

All Hair & Makeup Artists are required to register and be verified by the National Office in order to attend Nationals. All information, including host hotel reservation information will be sent to them directly by the National Office. If you know a Hair & Makeup Artist who would like to attend Nationals, please have them contact the National Office for registration information and verification. Once registered & verified H&M Artists will be emailed out to delegates with booking information. Delegates will make arrangements and payments for H&M Artist services directly with the verified artist. **All H&M Artists must be registered and verified by June 1st.**

Hair & Makeup Artists will not be permitted in the dressing room and backstage at any time.



SOCIAL MEDIA INFORMATION

Delegates are encouraged to create and maintain social media accounts representing their state title in alignment with the values of National United States Pageant.

Social media provides a powerful platform to:

- Share your community service initiatives
- Highlight your pageant journey and leadership growth
- Engage with supporters and sponsors
- Promote positive messaging and personal advocacy
- Represent your title with professionalism and pride

Delegates are expected to maintain respectful and age-appropriate content that reflects the integrity of their title. All posts should align with the organization's values and standards of conduct.

SPORTSMANSHIP & BEHAVIORAL EXPECTATIONS

The National United States Pageant is committed to fostering an environment of respect, encouragement, and positive leadership. Every delegate, parent, and supporter plays an important role in creating a welcoming and uplifting experience for all participants.

Delegates are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that reflects the values of the organization both on and off the stage.

Sportsmanship includes:

- Encouraging fellow contestants
- Respecting judges, staff, and volunteers
- Following event rules and instructions
- Demonstrating grace in both winning and losing
- Maintaining positive behavior on and off stage

Unsportsmanlike conduct, bullying, or negative behavior may result in disciplinary action, including removal from competition.

We believe pageantry builds character and leadership – and that begins with respect.



JUDGES

To maintain the integrity of the competition, delegates, parents, and family members may not approach or communicate with judges at any time before, during, or after the National Pageant.

This includes requesting or discussing scores, feedback, judging decisions, advice for future competitions, or any other pageant-related matters. This policy applies to in-person contact, email, social media, or any other form of communication.

Photos with judges are not permitted. The only exception is the official judges photo taken on stage following crowning with the newly crowned 2025 national royalty by the official event photographer.

We appreciate your cooperation in respecting these boundaries and helping maintain a fair and professional competition environment.

NATIONAL PAPERWORK

All delegates competing at the national level are required to complete and mail their National Paperwork to the National Office by June 1. Each form must include original signatures. Delegates who are under 18 years of age must have all documents signed by a parent or legal guardian.
